Dear all,

This has been a busy and, at times, intense week for our students, owing to the range of exams and assessments being completed. However, all staff have been incredibly impressed by the maturity demonstrated. It is clear that students want to do well and are taking every opportunity to secure their academic progress. The completion of a full set of formally completed assessments will enable staff to have an in-depth picture of the progress of each child, further enabling our curriculum recovery and response planning following extended periods of online learning.

The Prime Minister's announcement, regarding the extension of lockdown restrictions, has resulted in a need for us to refine a number of our planned summer term events. The DfE published updated guidance for schools on Tuesday afternoon and this is being used to replan, and in many cases, scale back a number of whole school events. In most cases the events will hopefully go ahead as planned, but may be moved online or reduced in size to accommodate audience capacity for performances. Unfortunately, our Archella Festival will need to be very different and new initial details are outlined below. I am so incredibly grateful for all the work being led by the Parents' Association here. Whilst I appreciate this may be frustrating for parents, our primary responsibility must be the safety of all members of the Archer community.

Please may I remind all parents of the importance of their children completing Lateral Flow Tests on Monday and Friday mornings. These tests are a core element of our risk management.

It has been a pleasure to formally launch our Wonder Week this week. Owing to the way in which we have planned the week, there are no implications owing to renewed government requirements. We are so looking forward to enabling students to have a very different timetable of experiences. A reminder that there is a contribution of £20 for the week, which also includes the trip day and is required today via ParentPay. It is lovely to have something so exciting for us all to look forward to.

The countdown is on! Only 1 more week to go until our first ever Wonder Week takes place.

During the week commencing Monday 28th June to Friday 2nd of July 2021 our school community will embark on our inaugural Wonder Week, our Super Curricular week exploring a range of rich learning opportunities. Our chosen theme of this year's Wonder Week is 'Wonders of the World'. Despite our global challenges over the last year or so, our world is wonderful, inspiring, and beautifully complex. The week will explore key themes of diversity, inclusion, places specific studies, culture and music from the past, present and future of our wonderful world.

During Wonder Week the school timetable will be suspended as students will experience a range of interactive workshops led by both external providers and school staff. The workshops will vary from sports and music to arts and creative writing, all exploring our wonderful world. As a part of our minimum offer across the week, all students in years 7 to 10 will have experienced sessions in the performing arts, a trip to the beach, an author visit, physical team games, and specialist workshops from a subject professional.

National Thank a Teacher Day is coming up on Wednesday the 23rd June and you can get involved!



Impeccable. That's right, we have completed a second week in exams, and we are still very much impeccable.



Year 9 - Miss Alcock



Ms Martin, Mr Gillo and I have been putting together the year 9 transition timetable, I look forward to sharing more details with you next week in our parent meeting.




