Dear all,

It was a real pleasure to be able to host an al fresco Leavers' Assembly on Thursday evening and we look forward to more celebrations for our Year 11 cohort this evening. It is incredibly hard to say goodbye, especially in such complex circumstances, but so special to be able to do this together as a community.

Unfortunately, this week we have experienced two confirmed cases of COVID19 in our Year 10 cohort. We have carefully reviewed all of our risk management procedures, in liaison with the London Coronavirus Response Centre, and all have been judged to be secure. The health and well being of all students and staff is my most important responsibility and one I take very seriously. However, as we have come to realise throughout this pandemic, there is a collective responsibility to reduce the spread of the virus. We have revisited expectations as a staff and student body to ensure we all feel safe and secure. I would ask that parents redouble their efforts to ensure that twice weekly Lateral Flow Tests are completed, as this is such a protective factor. Face masks remain a requirement in communal areas in our school. Your child should have a set of face masks on their person at all times, but sadly this is not always the case; on one day this week we gave out 100 face masks. Most importantly, if your child is symptomatic do not send them to school, please contact us instead for advice and book a PCR test. I am aware that the reality of COVID19 is hard for us all, but if we are to ensure that we have safe and healthy students and staff in school, we have to be prepared to take all the preventative steps that are needed.

We are so looking forward to Wonder Week next week and all the incredible opportunities it will afford our school community. I cannot decide what I am most looking forward to! Please do check central and year group specific information, regarding plans and expectations for your child. We cannot wait to tell you all about it.

Finally, I am so incredibly grateful for the outpouring of support for the Online Auction and Haven Estate Agent boards sponsorship. The support from you, the parent body, for our school, is so special and appreciated. 
Wonder Week Southend GradFest Yoga



We have 19 students who have collected over 300 merits this academic year, meaning they are top of the year 9 Honour Roll. Names were shared in tutor time this week - well done all of you!





Year 7 – Mr Wick


What an incredible week! Year 7 have had so many different opportunities to interact with a variety of natural beings.
