






The Archer 2021 Holiday Book Gift Guide

Skewing rather dark this year, the guide is full of mysteries and twists, perfect for those dark December evenings. Divided by age, you'll find something for almost everyone on your list.


For younger friends and family, up to age 7


	<p>When friends and family are scattered far and wide this Christmas, Clarice Bear must save the spirit of Christmas from floating away!</p>


