We're very much looking forward to the launch of our 'Free Week' during the week of 24th January. Archer families will have received detailed central communication from Miss Harrison, but here is a short snapshot below.

The aim of 'Free Week' is to simply slow down a little and to enable us to focus solely on the core business of teaching and learning, the joy of deep and rich curiosity into the topics we are studying and to create some space to feel fully in control.

What will 'Free Week' involve?

For students 'Free Week' will see no homework being set, no assessments or wider academic deadlines. There will be no wider school activities and the focus will be solely on the curriculum and the classroom. This week has been



deliberately scheduled to follow Depth Assessment Fortnight and during the break in enrichment. There will be no wider extra curricular clubs during 'Free Week' but annual enrichments, as part of Archer Plus, will continue for Year 10 and Year 11 students.

What do we hope students will gain from this week? How do we hope they will use the additional time generated?

We hope that students will take the opportunity for a mindful pause and a reset. Students will be encouraged by their tutors to use the additional time to catch up any outstanding homework or remote learning, for a spot of housekeeping and to ensure that everything is up to date. Students will be encouraged to ensure that their books and folders are up to date, that their academic work is well organised. The hope being that students will achieve that wonderful feeling of being organised, in control and that everything is in its rightful place.

Clara C on Catching Fire: I would recommend it, as it is funny & chilling & exciting.


Martha MS on And Then There Were None: I recommend this book to anyone who loves murder.



This week our lifelong learning session focuses on "Careers" as students are given the opportunity to interact with potential career choices as well as discussing what might be a good fit for them.



Year 7 – Ms Ogbaselase


