Dear all,

This has been a week of key events for our students and I have been incredibly impressed by the way in which they have thrown themselves into their different pursuits.

For our Lower School students our Wellbeing Week has afforded a rich opportunity to explore personal wellbeing and in particular resilience – the sense that we have all the power we need inside ourselves, but this does not mean that we do not need to practice and develop strategies to best support ourselves. Each day has begun with a set programme from the iHeart Foundation which has enabled a true common experience across the campus, this has then been expanded through a range of workshops and activities. Bringing the week to a close with our 'superhero' day (we are all our own superhero), to raise funds for our new wellbeing garden at the Upper School, has been great fun.

For our Upper School students, Year 10 have had the incredible opportunity of work experience and have made us very proud. It is so important for students to experience the wider world and how this can support them in aiming high for their futures – we look forward to welcoming them back to school on Monday and hearing all about their experiences. For Year 11, this week has seen their Ebacc Mock Exams and they have certainly demonstrated their resilience through this intense time. They have worked so hard and we know that this process will best position them to focus their revision and preparation as they move into the final stretch before formal examinations.

Thursday evening saw the first Welwyn Youth Drama Festival since March 2020 and our junior entry was performed to a standard that left the audience in awe. The students gave a stunning performance of Sophocles's Oedipus, no mean feat, and the adjudicators final comment that 'I feel Sophocles's would have loved that' was high praise indeed. A very proud moment for me, the CPA department, our students and their parents. Well done.

Next week we will be supporting the British Red Cross in their humanitarian appeal to help the people of Ukraine. Students in Year 9 and Year 10 will lead a series of fundraising events and are encouraged to bring small amounts of money to school. We will also host a non uniform day on Friday 18th March. Please know that we would never normally host two non uniform days so close together, but I wish to best support the students who have organised the week in raising as much money as possible for this important cause. 


This is the final date for the Year 11 Leavers' Ball.

Across the course of the week, staff have conducted placement visits to as many students as possible.


The feedback has been incredible and it is clear that the students have thrived in the work environment. The year group have been a credit to the school and I couldn't be prouder.


#### Wednesday


their business.
